11th Annual *March150* Special Exhibition and Art Sale Returns to Target Gallery *Proceeds benefit future exhibitions and programming at Torpedo Factory Art Center*

March 8, 2021 – Alexandria, Va. –Torpedo Factory Art Center’s popular annual exhibition and art sale, [March150](#), returns to Target Gallery for the 11th year. Proceeds benefit future exhibitions and programs at [Target Gallery](#) and the Art Center. Public sales are Sunday, March 14, through Sunday, April 4, 2021. Torpedo Factory Art Center is located at 105 N. Union St. More information and tickets can be found at torpedofactory.org/march150.

This year will look a bit different to make accommodations for COVID-19, but the core of March150 will remain unchanged. All art is created on gallery-supplied 10” x 10” panels and is priced at \$150. More than 100 original works by professional, emerging and amateur artists feature a diversity of topics and media. Find painting, photography, etching, mixed-media, fiber and more that reflect the zeitgeist of today.

A change this year, the first day of sales is a [special timed-ticket](#) event. **VIP First-Day Sales attendees on Saturday, March 13, have primary access to art buying**, while also allowing for physical distancing in Target Gallery. Tickets range from \$20 to \$50, depending on the desired 30-minute window. There is a maximum of five visitors per slot. To maximize this opportunity, attendees are encouraged build wish lists during the March150 Preview on Friday, March 12.

Public sales begin the following day on Sunday, March 14, at 10 a.m. Patrons can visit Target Gallery in person, with a maximum of 10 people in the space at any time. The full catalogue will be [posted to the website](#) and [Target Gallery's Facebook page](#). Remote sales can also be made by phone at 703-746-4590 or email via targetgallery@alexandriava.gov.

Another modification, the Art Party is moving online and it will be free, but [RSVPs are required](#). The **virtual festivities will be live on Saturday, March 27, at 7 p.m.** Keynote speaker Marta Staudinger of Latela Curatorial will discuss the value of art collecting and supporting local artists. The evening also features a sound performance by Jassie Rios, body painting by Kyera Delasario, trivia, and discounted art sales.

Like with in-person events of the past, attendees can buy **artwork for \$100 during the Art Party**. This special pricing continues for only for Art Party attendees until the exhibition closes on Saturday, April 3.

Target Gallery is partnering with the [Factory Society](#), an independent young-patrons group that supports the Art Center, for both the VIP First-Day Sales and the Virtual Art Party.

Last, to help people better engage with this year’s exhibition, Target Gallery is hosting the March150 Sunday Talks on March 14, 21 and 28. Posted to [Target Gallery's Facebook page](#), this series features a number of participating artists—amateur to professional and from all ages and backgrounds—highlighting how democratic the March150 exhibition is.

On average, Target Gallery grosses about \$16,000 from March150 each year. Proceeds benefit exhibitions and programs at the Art Center, such as the annual Solo Exhibition, The Late Shift, and others.

Target Gallery is open Wednesday through Sunday from 10 a.m. – 6 p.m. Target Gallery has a limited visitor capacity to allow for social distancing.
